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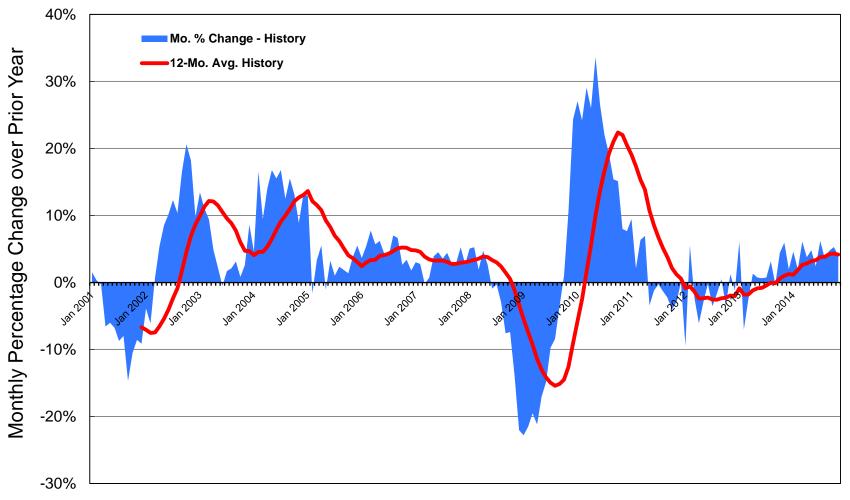

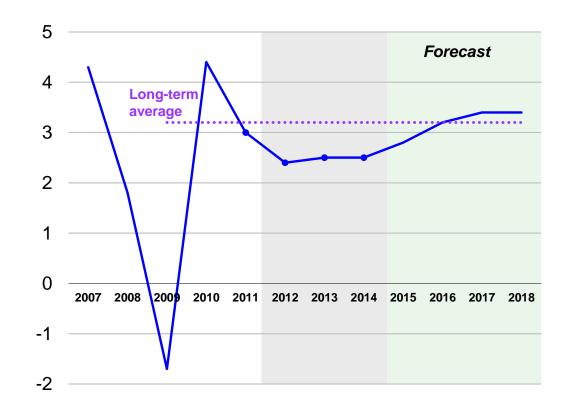

Real year-over-year GDP growth (%)

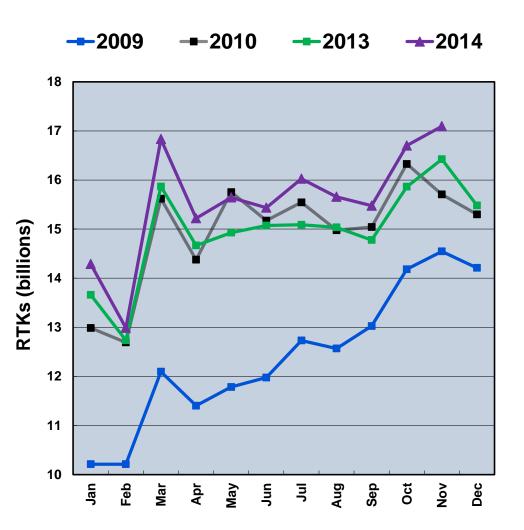
- Economic growth anemic since 2011

 - Weak trade growth, particularly in air cargo commodities
- Economic, trade growth now improving led by US

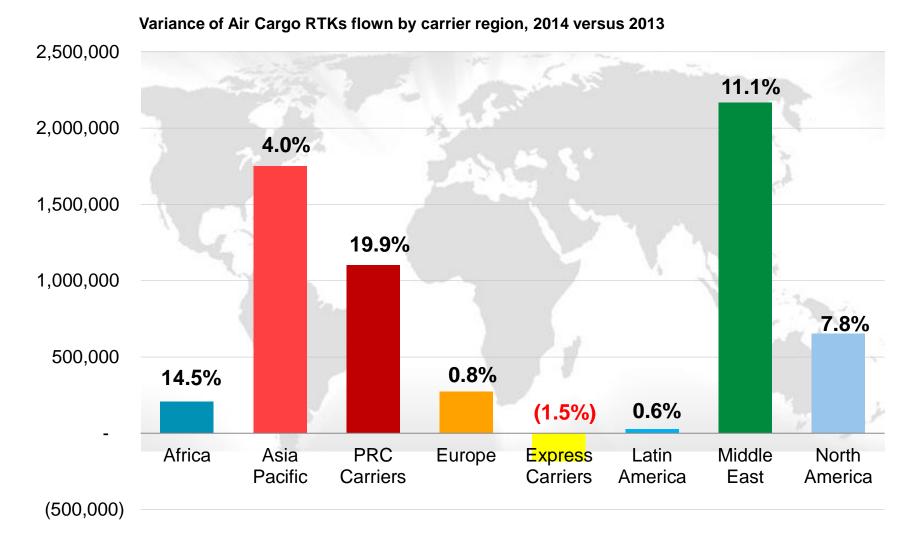
Air cargo demand has been recovering

- Air cargo growth stalled in mid-2011
 - Weak economy
 - Trade growth slowed
 - Economic uncertainty
- Growth resumed mid-2013 as the world economy strengthened
- Continued improvement expected in 2015
 - 4.1% Nov 2014 vs Nov 2013
 - 4.4% Nov 2014 YTD



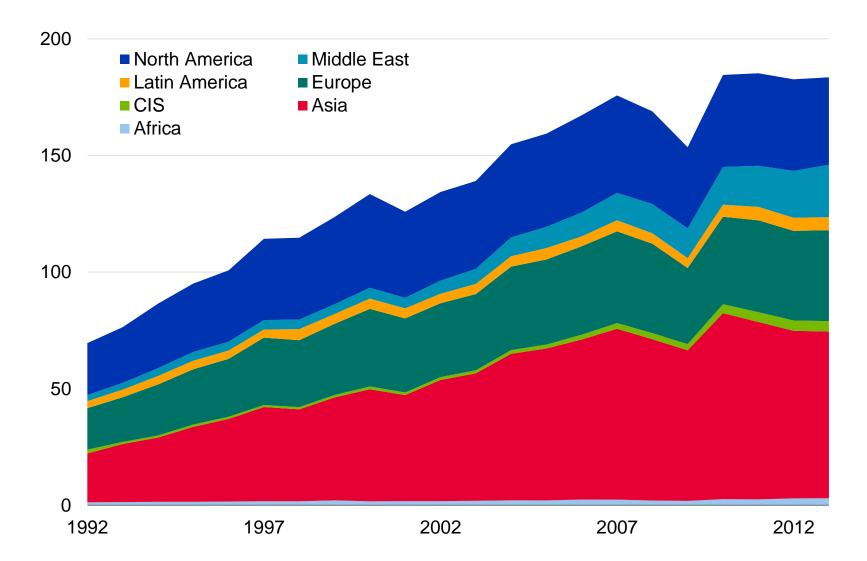

Air cargo growth rates are accelerating, but vary widely by region and airline business model November 2014 year-to-date

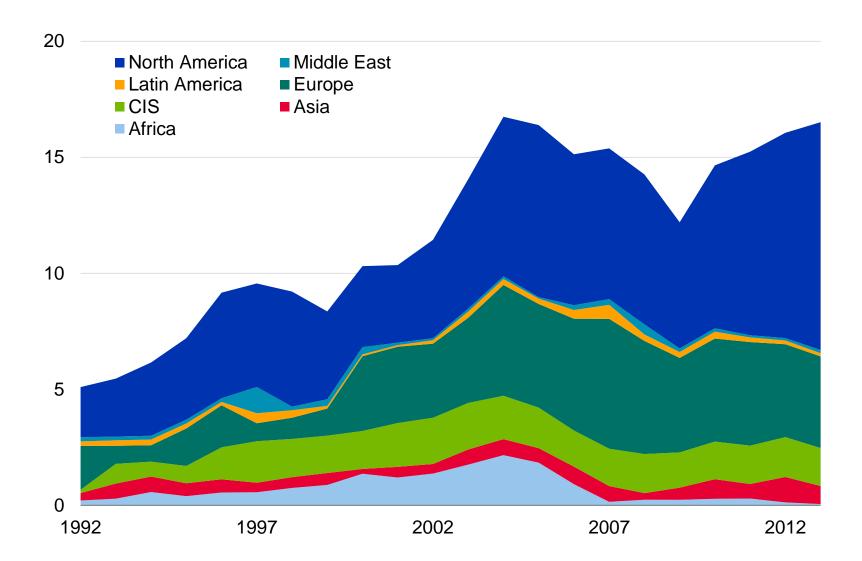

World scheduled air freight grew 0.5% in 2013 RTKs, billions

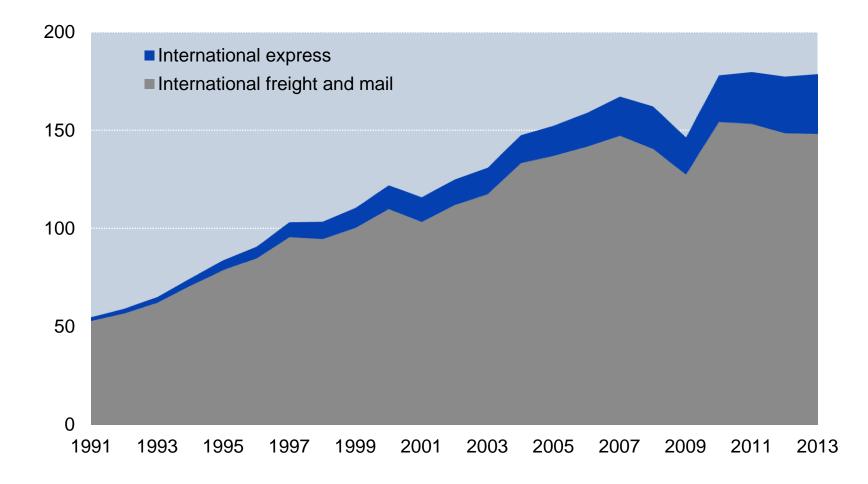


World charter air freight grew 2.9% in 2013 RTKs, billions

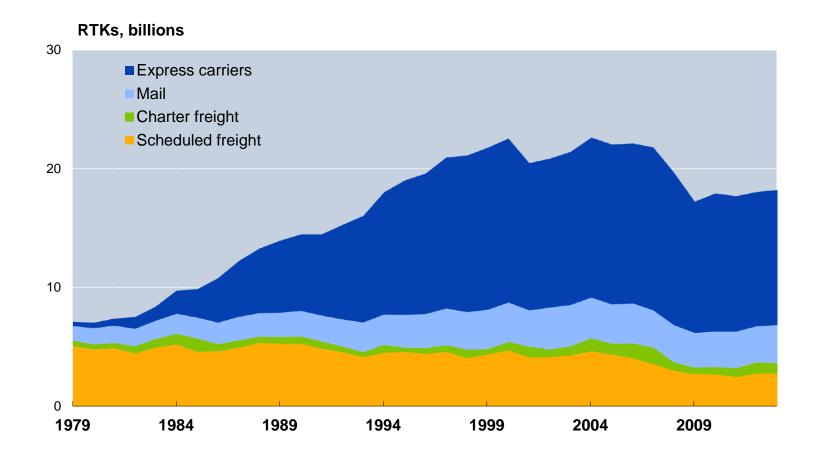


The international express market is growing faster than international freight and mail

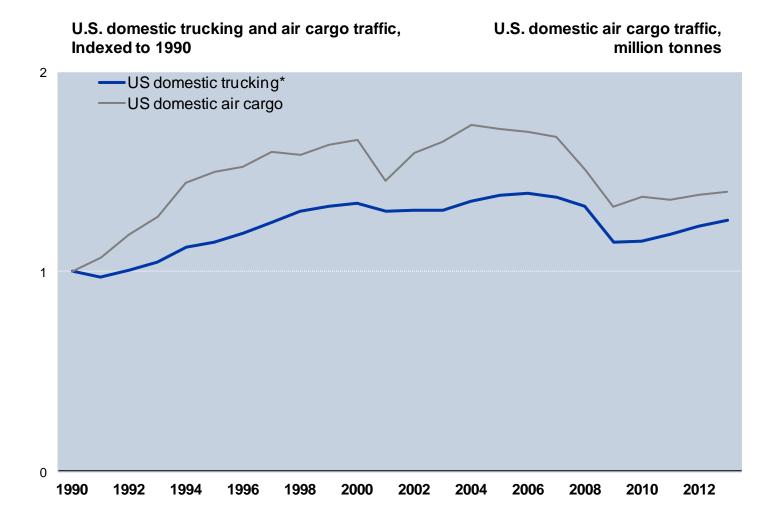
RTKs, billions



Express service dominates the US domestic air cargo market



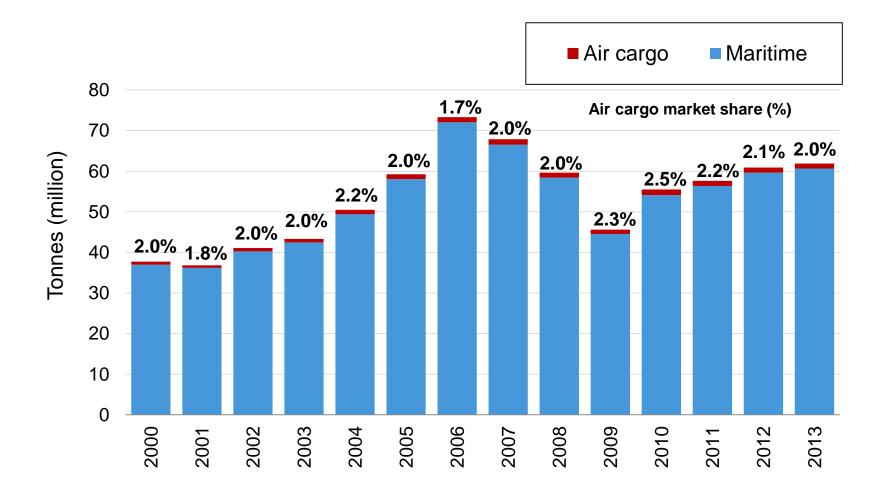
Trucking and Air Cargo Traffic Are Recovering at a Slow Rate

Air cargo has maintained its market share in the key trans-Pacific cargo market

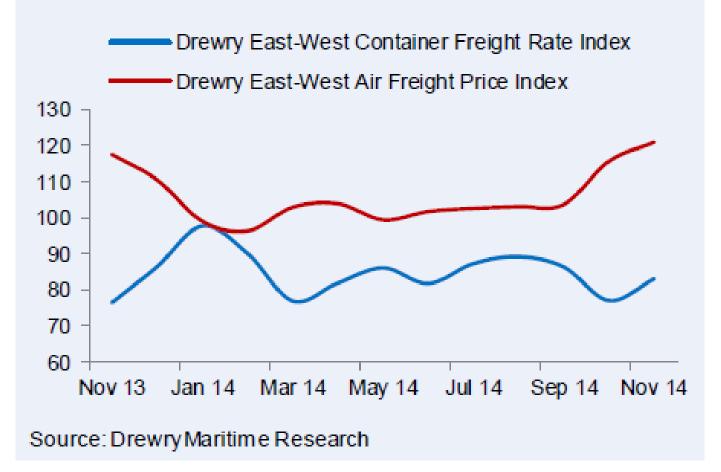
Top 20 air cargo commodities for the Asia–North America market



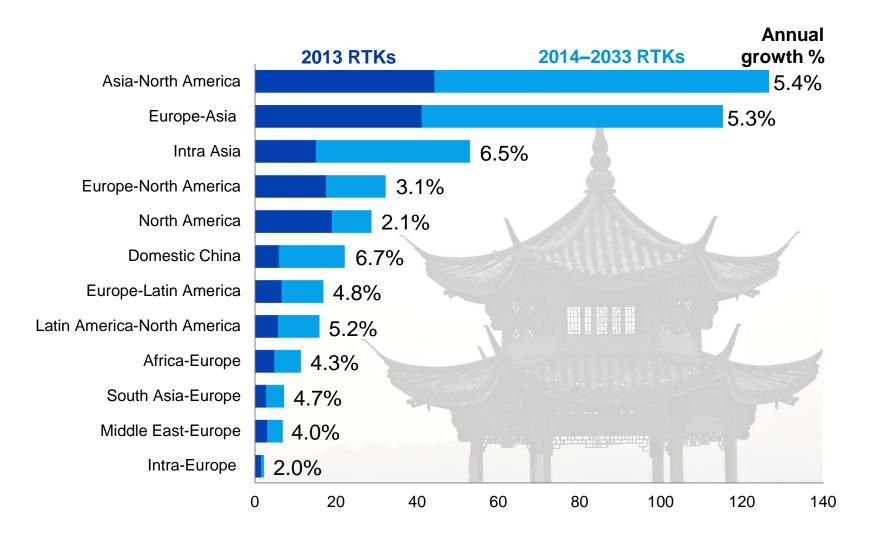

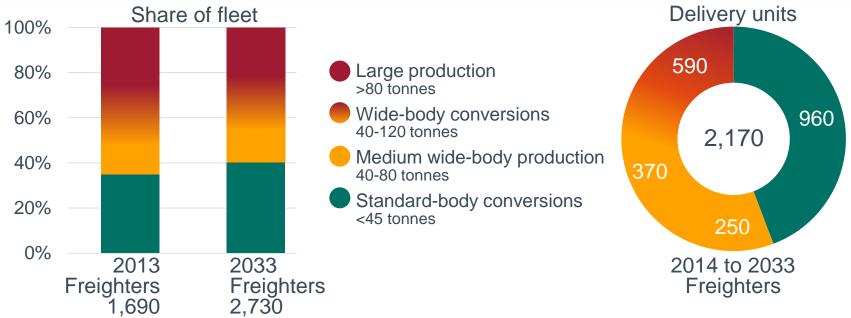

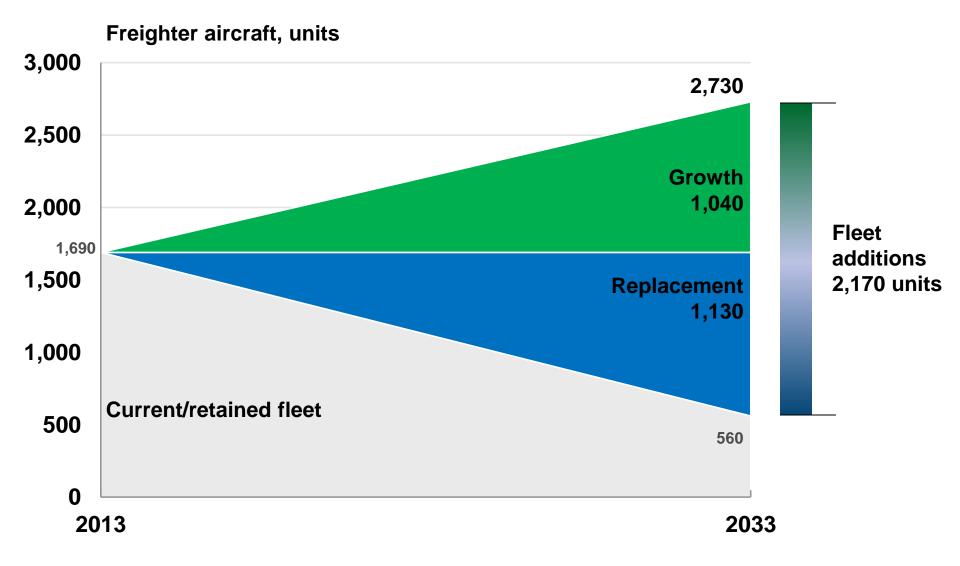

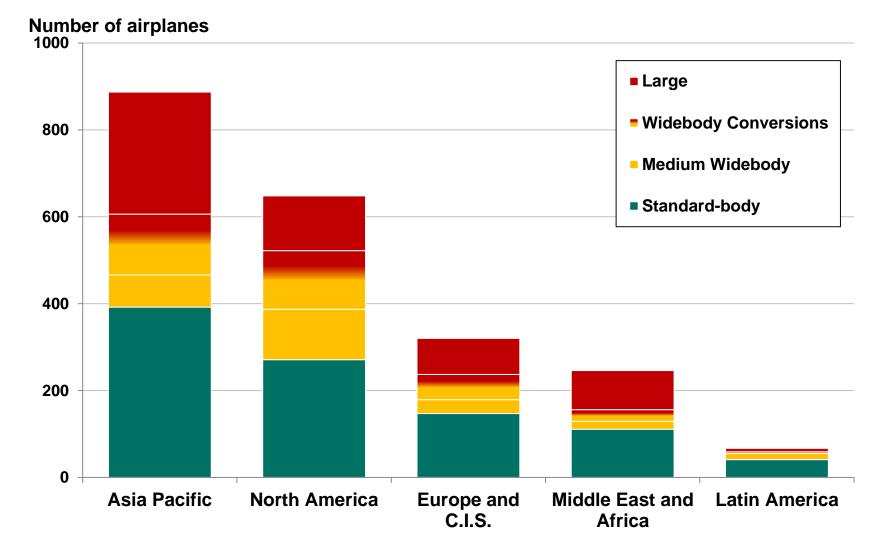




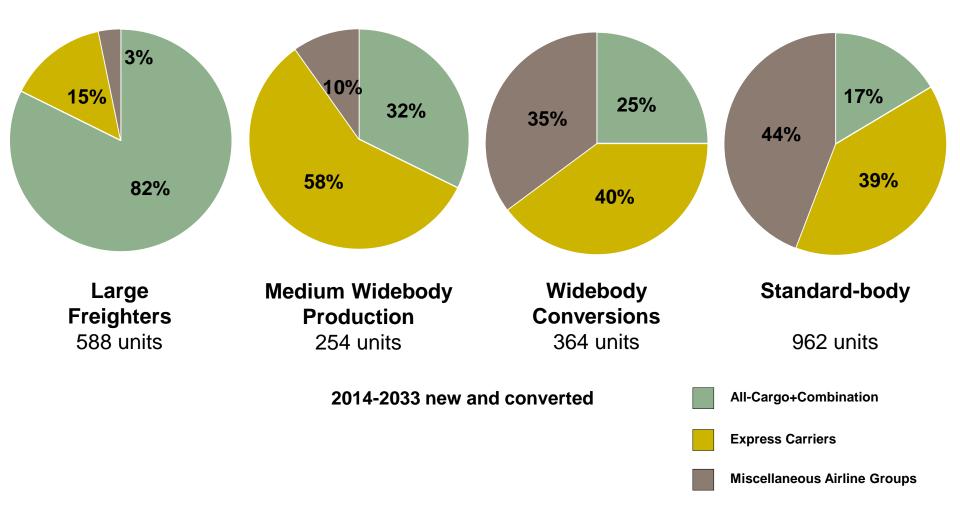
Freighter fleet additions for growth and replacement



Asia leads in total deliveries; North America follows



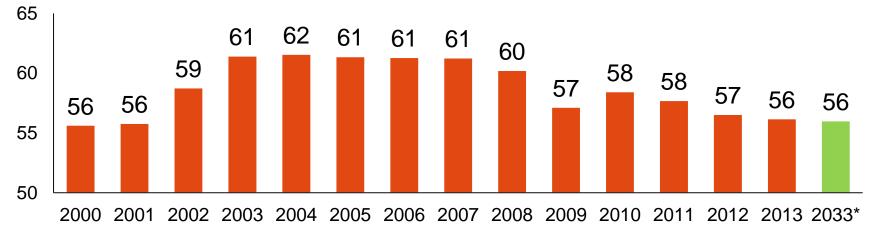
Large Freighters to General Carriers; Medium Widebodies for Express

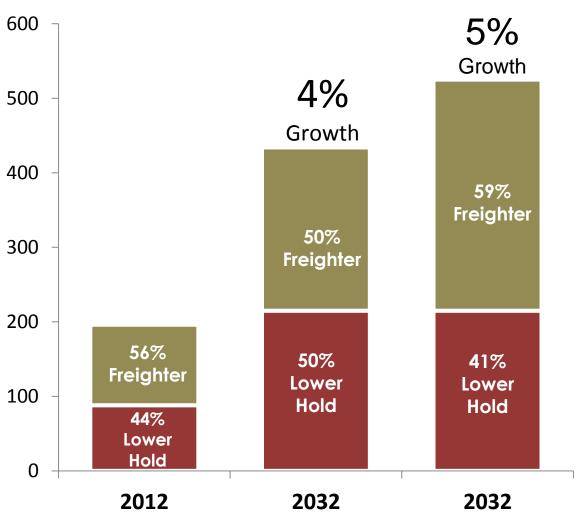
Freighter service advantages over passenger belly

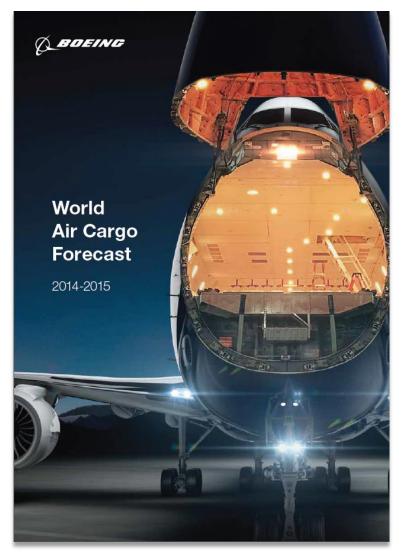


Slow trade, air cargo growth was mostly driven by weak demand growth World air cargo traffic recovering
